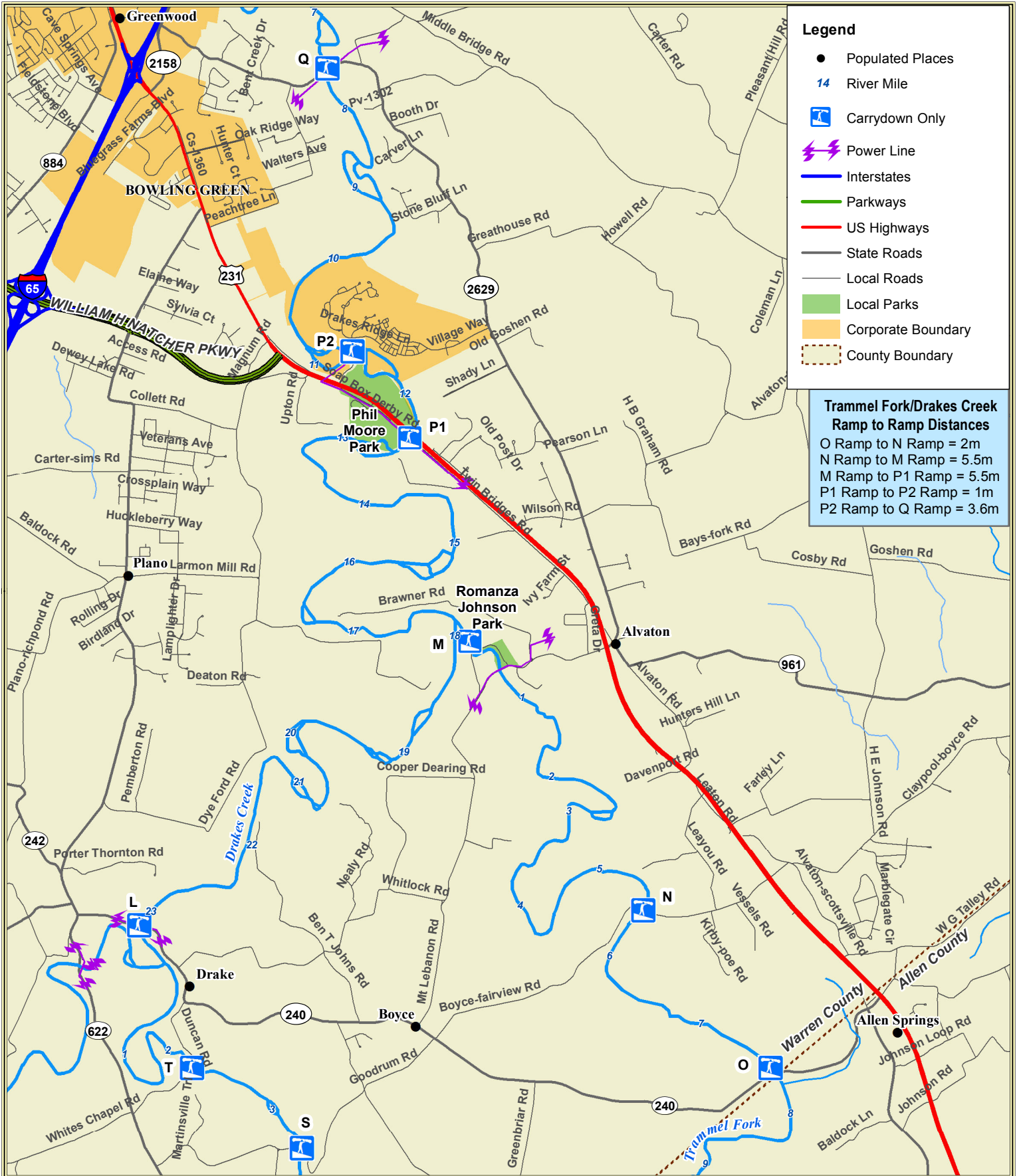


Blue Water Trails: Middle Fork, Trammel Fork and Main Stem of Drakes Creek

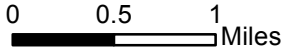

Trammel Fork/Drakes Creek Ramp to Ramp Distances

- O Ramp to N Ramp = 2m
- N Ramp to M Ramp = 5.5m
- M Ramp to P1 Ramp = 5.5m
- P1 Ramp to P2 Ramp = 1m
- P2 Ramp to Q Ramp = 3.6m

Middle Fork/Drakes Creek Ramp to Ramp Distances

- S Ramp to T Ramp = 1m
- T Ramp to L Ramp = 2.5m
- L Ramp to M Ramp = 5m
