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KENTUCKY PERIODIC WATERFOWL INVENTORY Conducted January 4-9 2017

The Mid-Winter Waterfowl survey has been delayed this year due to poor flight conditions last week. This year's surveys found similar conditions to last winter. The record high fall and early winter temperatures experienced throughout the Mississippi Flyway states this year seems to have delayed migration this season, and left high hopes for good waterfowl numbers during this survey. Unfortunately, the recent rain events we have experienced in KY left birds scattered across the landscape for all but one of the flights. Moist soil units, beaver impoundments and ponded depressions in crop fields provided excellent habitat for ducks and geese on the days the surveys were flown. Notes from Pat... Waterfowl observations were generally normal for this time of year. We have experienced some very odd weather prior to the survey date. Temperatures were normal for the season on survey day, but we have experienced temperatures both 15-20 degrees above normal and 15-20 degrees below normal for extended periods this winter. Habitat conditions were pretty good, although we have had minimal major rain events leaving the big rivers and tributaries in moderate flow at most. No flood conditions were noted during the survey and the majority of water holes likely have been pumped. Species distribution is roughly consistent with early January other than an unusually high percentage of green-winged teal that be using duck island for several weeks. Some species such as goldeneye and canvasback normally associated with colder, mid-Winter weather were not observed in significant numbers.

Notes from Terri... The Central survey was conducted with clear sunny skies and mild winds <10 mph, daytime temperatures ranged from 30 degrees at start to mid to lower 40's by mid-day. Standing water in low lying fields indicated recent rainfall however most reservoirs appeared to be lower than normal winter pool levels. Barren and Green River Lake, which typically have low winter pool depths, appeared to have more exposed mud flats and dried up coves or oxbows than normal. No frozen water was observed on any reservoirs and even small ponds and lakes which showed signs of low water levels appeared to be unfrozen at time of the survey. The Ohio River appeared to be slightly above normal level but remained within banks. In the central region the most abundant dabbling ducks were Black ducks (1520) followed by Mallards (1286) and Gadwall (32). Black ducks were only observed on Dale Hollow Lake and Cedar Creek Lake while Mallards were easily the most wide spread dabbling duck in the central region occurring throughout the region in varying group sizes. Diver numbers were low and only observed on Dale Hollow Lake, Canvasback (46) and Ring-neck (55). Canada Geese (843) observations were lower than expected with majority of observations coming from the Ohio River.

Notes from Wes.... The Eastern flight was conducted in mostly clear to partly cloudy skies, with 5-20 mph west winds, mostly in the 10-15 mph range. Temperatures were in the low to mid throughout the day. Temperatures have been mild this hunting season. The season's rainfall has been lower than average, but late rains have provided water across the landscape during the survey. No ice was noted during the survey. Most reservoirs were either at or lower than winter pool. Cave Run Lake had some water covering the shallow flats, but vegetation seemed a little sparse. The Ohio River was above normal levels, with high current from the recent rains, but was within the banks. The Northern Licking river was also above normal levels with high current. Most fields with low areas and oxbows around the rivers showed good moist soil habitat, and were full of water. With the lack of ice and abundant moist soil habitat throughout the state, waterfowl are scattered across the state, making this year's count seem low. The most abundant dabbling duck was Mallards (859). Black duck (194) was the second most abundant puddle duck followed by Gadwall (76) and Green-winged Teal (27), with no other dabbling ducks being observed in large numbers. There were no dabbling ducks present on Cave Run Lake, and fewer geese than normal. Very few divers were seen this year. Ring-necks were the most abundant diver (35) followed by Bufflehead (31), Goldeneye (13), Scaup (13), and Canvasback (12). There were 1,634 Canada geese counted total. I hope everyone had a great holiday season, and enjoy the remainder of your duck and goose season!

Here is a map showing the average temps nationwide from September to November. This freakish weather event has attributed to the low numbers we have experienced so far:




Figure 2. Statewide rankings for average temperature during September—November 2016, as compared to each September—November period since 1895. Darker shades of orange indicate higher rankings for warmth, with 1 denoting the coldest month on record and 122 the warmest.

This is the first waterfowl ground count of the 2016-17 wintering period. Many areas did not have the opportunity to survey this week as this is a week earlier than we traditionally conduct the survey. In general, low numbers of ducks are around. Warm weather in Kentucky and in northern areas has the mass of duck migration still well north of Kentucky. Look for improvements in the coming weeks with cold fronts hitting the US and Canada. This breeding season had the highest number of ducks ever recorded (again) on breeding ground surveys. Look for above average numbers of ducks to eventually make it to Kentucky.

Overall, most of the states wetlands are in relatively good shape. In some regions local agricultural plantings were impacted by the summer rains and/or flooding and yields may be reduced. Moist soil plants look great across the state. Wetland conditions are still good considering the lack of rain this fall, and should only improve with additional precipitation.
