December 12, 2019 Kentucky Sandhill Crane Survey

This is the Sandhill crane ground count survey for December 9-13, 2019. Barren River Lake was at 540.4 ft on 12/11. This is within twelve feet of summer pool, but it being drained swiftly, and many cranes were observed roosting on the upper reaches of the lake and even field roosting. The roost sites in Hardin County have not yet produced birds during the survey, but several small groups have been spotted in the surrounding communities. The roost ponds have water and there are plenty of harvested crop fields in the area.

Water levels at Barren River Lake are quite high, therefore eliminating sand bars and shallow shorelines usually used by the cranes. The roost sites in Hardin County are holding a small number of birds so far, and several small groups can be seen feeding in the surrounding communities. The roost ponds have water, and there is standing water in many fields after the weekend's heavy rains. There are plenty of harvested crop fields in the area.

January 3, 2020 Kentucky Sandhill Crane Survey

This is the Sandhill crane ground count survey for December 29, 2019- January 4, 2020. Water levels at Barren River Lake have continued to rise with the new round of rain. Levels are currently at 3.5 feet above summer pool and rising, eliminating sand bars and shallow shorelines used by the cranes. Just over one hundred birds were seen at and around the Hardin County roost sites, and a few small groups can be seen feeding in the surrounding communities. Many areas have standing water in the fields, and there are plenty of harvested crop fields in the area.

January 24, 2020 Kentucky Waterfowl Ground Counts

This is the ground count survey for January 21-24, 2020. The week started with temps that stayed below freezing for a few days, but is ending with more rain and mild temps. There have been individual reports of hunter success through the week, but these have been scattered and localized. Likewise, there are reports of large concentrations of waterfowl that are not captured on this survey, as most of the WMA's along the lower Ohio and Mississippi rivers are still underwater. Lake levels continue to remain high; many remain well above normal levels. There is an abundance of backwater habitat also still present.

Ballard WMA closed on Saturday, 1/4, and will remain closed until it is safe for hunters to access. We will advertise details or on the department webpage, the Ballard WMA Facebook page, and the KDFWR main Facebook page. Hunters may also call the Ballard Waterfowl Hotline, 270-224-2244 ext. 1 to get updates. Doug Travis and Boatwright WMA's have roads effected by backwater, so be careful trying to access these WMA's and be aware of the rules that apply during floodwater conditions. See the waterfowl guide online for more info, available on our website.

Habitat across the state is still holding on strong. There was ample moist soil vegetation on most areas and hunt units going into the season, and most of these are still full of food.

Duck season began on Thanksgiving Day, with the first segment running from November 28 – December 1. The second segment of duck season opened on December 7th, and NEW THIS YEAR, will run until January 31, 2020. Goose season opened November 28, 2019 and will remain open until February 15, 2020. The western zone youth hunt will be February 1-2, 2020. Also new this year, is the daily bag limit reduction from 2 birds to 1 for Northern Pintail. All other bag limits remain the same. We wish everyone great luck this year. Be safe, and enjoy your time afield.
