Administrative Services

The Administrative Services Division is responsible for such agency-wide operations as budgets, personnel and payroll, cost and grant accounting, purchasing, inventory and supplies. This division also oversees the agency's information technology, which includes the website, online license and permit sales, and Telecheck.

Law Enforcement

The Law Enforcement Division enforces state and federal regulations and statutes related to statewide hunting, fishing and boating. This division includes nine districts and canine, special investigation and internet investigation units. Conservation Officers also present programs to civic and sportsman's organizations.

Wildlife Division

The Wildlife Division manages wildlife and habitat on both public and private lands within the state. This division is responsible for providing public access and hunting opportunities to sportsmen and sportswomen, conducting research and surveys on a variety of game and non-game species, and drafting regulations that allow responsible harvest and provide protection of wildlife when necessary.

Fisheries Division

The Fisheries Division protects, conserves and enhances sport fisheries and aquatic resources. This division performs research, management, private pond technical guidance, fish culture and transportation, habitat enhancement, environmental review, and stream restoration and mitigation. In partnership with the Engineering Division, this division provides fishing access through boat ramp and bank access construction.

The Information and Education Division conducts hunter safety and aquatic education programs, operates three regional conservation camps and provides classroom wildlife education for elementary-age children. This division publishes informational hunting, fishing and boating guides along with the award-winning Kentucky Afield magazine. It also operates the agency customer service center and the Salato Wildlife Education Center, and produces the Emmy® Award-winning "Kentucky Afield" television and radio shows.

Engineering Division

The Engineering Division designs, constructs and maintains statewide public access areas for anglers, hunters and boaters. This division ensures fishing access through boat ramp, bank access and dam construction and maintenance. It also surveys and marks boundaries on agency-owned wildlife management areas, and constructs and maintains facilities for conservation camps.
