

## Directions

The area is 6.2 miles from the intersection of KY 448 and KY 1638, in Brandenburg, and 2.7 miles from the junction of KY 1638 and the Dixie HWY (U.S. 31 W) in Muldraugh.

## Fees

### Admission Fees:

Children under 12 admitted free

\$3 per person for daily entry permit, available at the gate  
\$30 per person for annual entry permit, available online at [fw.ky.gov](http://fw.ky.gov).

### Special Activity Fees:

Additional charge to all visitors, including children under 12, for horse trails, mountain bike trails and shooting ranges

\$7 per person for daily permit (in addition to \$3 entry fee), available at the gate.

\$70 per person for annual special activity permit, (in addition to \$30 annual entry permit) available online at [fw.ky.gov](http://fw.ky.gov).

## Activities

### Fishing

Area includes 5 miles of Otter Creek and 2.4 miles or frontage along the Ohio River.

Trout are stocked in Otter Creek three times in the spring and a fourth time in October.

A seasonal catch-and-release season for trout is from October through the end of March.

Anglers must possess a valid entry permit and have an appropriate fishing license and permit, if applicable.

### Hunting

Spring squirrel hunting available under statewide season.

Hunters must possess a valid entry permit and have valid hunting licenses and permits, if applicable.

Opportunities in fall for small game, furbearer, deer and turkey hunting.

Quota firearm hunts schedule for deer, in addition to separate archery and crossbow seasons.



### Hiking

#### Hiking is allowed on all trails.

### Horseback Riding

- Horseback riding is allowed on the Red Cedar Trail (RCT) and the Boone Hollow Trail (BHT).
- Trail Status Hotline: 502-942-5052

Please note: To participate in horseback riding at Otter Creek Outdoor Recreation Area, you must provide your own horses.

### Mountain Bike Riding

- Mountain biking is allowed on the Otter Creek Trail (OCT) and the Valley Overlook Trail (VOT).
- Trail Status Hotline: 502-942-5052

### Archery Range

- The 3-D archery range is up and running.

### Rifle Range

- Tube Range - 100 Yards
- The shooting range is for single projectile firearms only; no shotshells allowed.

### Disc Golf

- Disc golf is a disc game in which individual players throw a flying disc into a basket or at a target.

### Canoeing and Kayaking

- Canoes and kayaks are allowed on Otter Creek and the Ohio river.
- Carry-down launch ramp at Ohio River for canoes, kayaks, and small boats.
- State law requires a Type I, II, or III personal flotation device (PFD) on all boats.
