2025 KY NASP® State Championship



The 2025 KY NASP® State Championship will once again be held at the KY Exposition Center, located at 937 Phillips Lane, in Louisville. This year's event will be held on Friday, March 14th and Saturday, March 15th. The competition will host approximately 7,500 very excited archers!

Info for Coaches

When you arrive...Teams need to

arrive at least an hour before their scheduled flight time. Upon arriving, coaches will pick up their team packets. Bullseve registration table is located at the back of the lobby, near the escalators and the 3D Challenge registration and scoring table is located to the right after you enter from the front of the facility. Payment for team registration is due at this time, so please work with your school well in advance to ensure payment may be made at the tournament. Teams are responsible for all archers registered at the close of registration. Substitutions do not increase your amount due. Registered archers and three coaches will enter into the East Hall entrance, located behind the bullseye registration table. Packets will contain a copy of your current roster, a form for changes, scorecard labels, and the archer's scorecards. If you have changes, please fill out the form immediately and turn in to the scoring room (bullseye scoring is located in the East Hall entrance hallway and 3D Challenge scoring is located at their registration table. All changes must be made before any team members begin shooting. Once all changes have been made, please take time to go through the scorecards and labels to make sure they are correct. The labels will not be adhered to the scorecards, so please allow time before the flight to place them on the bottom of the scorecards. Using a No. 2 pencil, please bubble in the shooter numbers or have the archers bubble in their own shooter numbers. Shooter numbers are found on the labels. Bows should be hung on the racks for inspection at least 15 minutes before flight time. Coaches need to be available during bow inspection and during the flight. If the tournament is running behind, please remain off of the range until called for by the announcer. Please remember at all times that everyone involved in the tournament has the same goal - the archers! This event wouldn't be possible without all of the incredible effort from the coaches, parents, and volunteers and on behalf of KY NASP®, THANK YOU!

Remember Student/Parent Waivers - A waiver must be signed by each archer and the archer's parent or legal guardian and kept on file by the coach. Coaches will be asked at registration to sign a document stating they have received signed waivers for each participating archer. Archer Registration Fees

Archer Bullseye Registration Fee: \$35 per registered archer will apply for this event. Registration fees do not include event shirts for archers. A school must pay the registration fee for ALL archers registered at the close of registration (at 8am ET on 2/19) regardless of participation. Bring checks/payments **made payable to KY NASP®** and present to the registration desk before participation. Place the school name and "Kentucky" in the memo line on all checks.

Archer 3D Challenge Registration Fee: \$25 per registered archer will apply for this event. Registration fees do not include event shirts for archers. A school must pay the registration fee for ALL archers registered at the close of registration, regardless of participation. Please bring checks/payments **made payable to IBO** and present to the registration desk before participation. Place the school name and "Kentucky" in the memo line on all checks.

Payment for the bullseye event and the 3D Challenge event MUST BE SEPARATE CHECKS because they are made out to separate entities.

Preventing Tournament Issues



Respect the Lanes

During tournaments, archers are given a 60" wide lane to share with their lane mate during the competition. This means each archer has 30". Make sure your archers are courteous to their lane mate and that their entire body, their equipment, and their quiver remain inside of their lane. Invading more than their allotted space is considered unsportsmanlike conduct and places them at a risk for being disqualified. Do your archers a huge favor and have them practice staying in their own lanes.

Nocking and Drawing in a Safe Direction

Rule 4.4.1. The archer must nock, pre-draw, draw and aim in a manner that keeps the arrow pointed safely towards the target throughout the process. (Below the top of the backstop curtain, and away from the floor).

To nock the bow with the arrow pointed at the floor or to pull the bow back with an arrow nocked and pointed above or below the curtain is a safety violation. The correct procedure must be followed and will be enforced during the tournament. Correcting the behavior during a tournament is disruptive to the archer and possibly others. Please make sure every team member is nocking and drawing in a safe manner with the arrow pointed safely towards the target.

Good Sportsmanship

8. Sportsmanship: Archers, coaches, volunteers, and spectators are expected to respect others. Acts of unsportsmanlike conduct will result in disqualification and or removal from the event. NASP® officials and tournament directors have the right to make on site determination of any situation not covered by these rules. NASP® officials' decisions are final. KENTUCKY: all coaches, archers, and parents are required to read the rules and protocol document. Coaches, archers, and parents are to be aware that arguing with NASP officials / tournament directors is an act of unsportsmanlike conduct and could result in being removed from the event. Coaches exhibiting unsportsmanlike conduct may have their BAI certification terminated and will be reported to their respective school district.

The following are a few examples of unsportsmanlike conduct:

- 8.1. Purposefully disturbing or distracting another archer with excessive touching or talking.
- 8.2. Failure to follow lane official direction.
- 8.3. Physical or verbal abuse of any person at the event.
- 8.4. Attempts to cheat include:
- 8.4.1. Using disallowed equipment.
- 8.4.2. Improper call-out of arrow value.
- 8.4.3. Improper bubbling of arrow value.
- 8.4.4. Erasure of anything on the scorecard. Only lane officials may use erasers.
- 8.5. Behavior considered disruptive, unsafe, offensive, or otherwise inappropriate may result in disqualification and/or expulsion of the archer, coach, & observers. Examples include, but are not limited to:
- 8.5.1. Intentional or repeated bumping of another archer or archer's bow
- 8.5.2. Harassing, intimidating, or threatening another.
- 8.5.3. Encroaching beyond the archer's assigned half of the 30" in the shooting lane.
- 8.5.4. Ignoring the L vs. R assignment in the shooting lane.
- 8.5.5. The use of Vulgar or otherwise offensive language, or on shirts or banners. KENTUCKY: all coaches are expected to hold their archers to a high standard of behavior. Inappropriate behavior from archers on the range will not be tolerated. Unsportsmanlike conduct may result in the archer being removed from participation in upcoming events.

It is the coach's responsibility to know the rules and, to the best of their abilities, ensure that every archer abides by those rules. Safety is the number one priority of KY NASP®, followed by good sportsmanship on everyone's part. Section 8 of the rules is dedicated to Sportsmanship alone! It would be a great idea to go over this section with your archers every year. Unfortunately, every year it seems more complaints are made about coaches or parents conducting themselves in an unflattering manner rather than archers. Remember, young archers are watching and learning from our behavior. Let's make sure our behavior is such that it teaches positive virtues. **INTEGRITY. HONESTY. CHARACTER. GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP.**

Over time, tournament results and scores are generally forgotten but the actions of the archers, coaches, and spectators may be recalled for a very long time. During competitions, think about how you want to be remembered in the future.

Integrity. Honesty. Good Sportsmanship.

Prepare Your Archers

Scoring Protocol - To keep the flight running smoothly for your archers and the other archers in the tournament, please make sure they are efficient in the scoring process. Most delays happen during the scoring process and for some archers, it becomes a source of frustration. NASP® developed a new scoring protocol a few years ago as well as a video for demonstration. The video may be viewed online at http://www.naspschools.org/learning-center/. Please utilize this protocol during practice until the archers feel comfortable and confident in scoring. During the tournament, if an issue arises at the target where the students need help, they simply need to raise their hands to alert a lane official for help. Lane officials are more than happy to assist!

Scorecards - Many tournament delays happen at the target and involve simple mistakes on the scorecard. Archers should not only know the scoring protocol but how to fill out the scorecard in an efficient and timely manner. Practice scorecards may be downloaded online at www.fw.ky.gov/Education/Documents/naspScorecardSample.pdf. Use these during after-school practices so the archer feels comfortable with the process. For best scanning results, the bubbles on the card should be filled in completely and dark enough for the scanner to pick up.

Handling Arrows Properly - Well coached archers are easy to spot when it comes to proper arrow retrieval and handling! When an archer pulls all five arrows from the target, laying them at the foot of the target one at a time, the archer picks them up and evens up the points on the top of the target. The archer then places one hand on the bottom of the shaft, covering the points. The other hand is placed around the shaft, further up the arrow, near the vanes. The archer then walks back to the quiver, with both hands holding the arrows in front of the archer, and places the arrows in the quiver. Attendees may purchase online in advance at https://kec.parkmobile.io/.../kentucky.../events/240487 at a cheaper rate but online passes are single use parking and does not allow for in/out privileges. Purchase must be made at least 15 minutes prior to coming through the gate to allow time for the system to refresh.

Buses are \$30. Buses may drop off in front of the KEC but must park in Lots P or R.

*Just a reminder - another event will be at the Expo Center. The North Wing Skywalk will be open and parking in E Lot will be available.

The tournament uses the standard Morrell Youth Targets that have been "beefed up" for the state tournament. They are not recommended for use by a school that is practicing on them daily but more for home use or for use at a school hosted tournament. The targets are able to be re-stuffed as needed.

Purchased target(s) will need to be picked up after the conclusion of the last flight on Saturday, March 15th at approximately 4:45 pm. When you arrive at the tournament during the competition (Friday or Saturday), please go to the South podium and you will be given the number(s) of your target(s). Online sales refunds will only be given

before March 11th. Please email christie.kynasp@gmail.com for more information or if you need to cancel your order. If you do not pick up your target(s) on Saturday, they will be donated it to a school in need.

State Tournament Scholarships

A total of \$35,500 in scholarships will be awarded at the conclusion of the tournament!

The top 15 scoring senior males and top 15 scoring senior females at the 2025 KyNASP® State Bullseye Tournament will each receive a \$1000 scholarship to the post-secondary institution they will be attending after graduation.

In addition to the senior scholarships, 11 random senior Academic Archer drawings will be held throughout the state tournament for \$500 scholarships. Participation in the tournament is required.

NASP[®] Lane Official Training Video - Great Info for Coaches Too!


