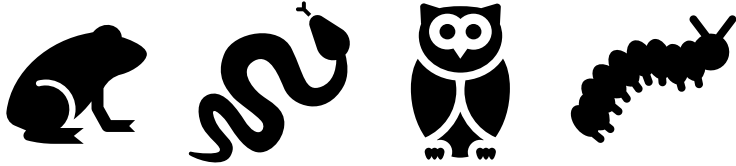

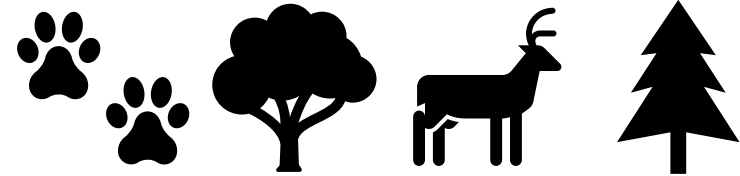
1. How is your height different than a **black bears**? My height is \_\_\_\_\_ and the bear's height is 7 feet.

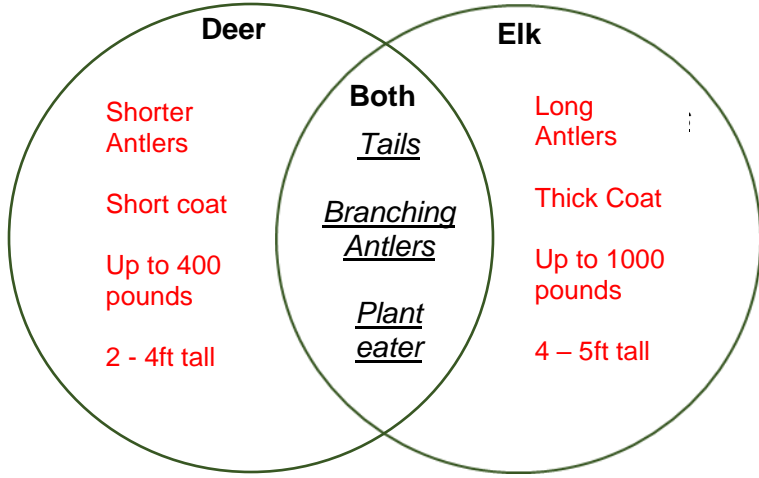


9. What do **bald eagles** eat? Fish, waterfowl, small animals, carrion (dead animals)
