November 24, 2020 Kentucky Waterfowl Ground Counts

This is the first waterfowl ground count of the 2020/2021 wintering period. November has proven to be mostly warmer than usual, but a slight cool front has dropped in this week. Weather for the first split is predicted to be mild. There are loads of ducks being reported to our north. Missouri reported 600,000 ducks, although no significant migrations were noticed in the last couple weeks. Snow geese however, did start to show up. Illinois is also reporting good numbers of ducks. Most areas in KY are reporting numbers that are close to average or slightly below average for November. Hopefully that means there are plenty of ducks still to come.

Habitat across the state varies, but most are reporting excellent moist soil habitat, and good to excellent habitat over all. Most areas were able to plant crops this year, and water levels are good. As always, there are some units that still need some water, but overall, wetland conditions and food availability are set for a productive waterfowl season.

Duck season will begin on Thanksgiving Day, with the first segment running from November 26 – 29. The second segment of duck season opens on December 7, and will run until January 31, 2021. Goose season will open November 26, 2020 and will remain open until February 15, 2021. The western zone youth hunt will be February 6-7, 2021. Also new this year, is the daily bag limit reduction for Scaup (blue bills). The new Scaup bag limit is one bird November 26-29, and December 7-18, 2020 and two birds December 19. 2020 through January 31, 2021. All other bag limits remain the same.
