December 10, 2021 Kentucky Waterfowl Ground Counts

This is the ground count for December 6 through December 10, 2021. The second segment of duck season opened this week, and weather hasn't been great. The cold front early on gave way to mild weather. Some areas lost birds without seeing any replacements. There is a storm front coming Friday, but from the south. Habitat conditions are still dry, but food is plentiful. Growing conditions this summer were favorable for both planted crops and moist soil plants. Most areas report ample food available for ducks this season. Water levels in hunt units are mostly right where we want them, but units that cannot be mechanically filled are dryer than normal. We are adding water where possible to keep adequate hunting water. Overall, wetland conditions and food availability are excellent.

Duck season will run until January 31, 2022. Goose season will remain open until February 15, 2022. The western zone youth hunt will be February 5-6, 2022. All bag limits remain the same as last season. Check out the waterfowl hunting web page for more deatails.
