November 21-23, 2016 Kentucky Waterfowl Ground Counts

Due to the Thanksgiving Holiday and staff being on leave, some areas were not surveyed this week.

Duck numbers are still lower than normal, but we have picked up new birds since last week. The cold weather has finally started and the ducks are starting to trickle in.

Overall, most of the states wetlands are still in relatively good shape, considering the lack of rain in last 2 months

Kentucky's 2016-17 duck and goose seasons open Thursday, November 24. The first duck and goose season segment will close on Sunday, November 27th. The second segment of duck and season will open December 5th and the duck season will remain open until Sunday, January 29th. The second segment of the goose season will remain open until Wednesday, February 15, 2017. Good luck to all waterfowl hunters and remember to be safe whenever you are out pursuing the resource this hunting season.
