 - CWD Working Group requested revisiting the overlap of these two deer hunting seasons in [301 KAR 2:172](#)
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity
- Create a new January 3-day antlerless firearms hunt in Zone 1-3 counties
 - Amend [301 KAR 2:172](#) Deer hunting seasons, zones, and requirements
 - Create an antlerless only firearms hunt the last 3 days of Kentucky's deer season (Martin Luther King holiday weekend) in deer zones 1-3
 - Remove references to disposal permits to conform with [301 KAR 2:176](#)
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity

 - Add hoop net and seine with construction and method specifications as a legal commercial fishing gear for invasive carp
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity

- Modifications of Regulations Pertaining to the Harvest of Invasive Carp
 - Amend [301 KAR 1:152](#) – Harvest and sale of invasive carp
 - Add reporting of the timeframe of when fishing activities will occur and the commercial fishing gear to be employed to the required call in information
 - Increase harvest ratio of invasive carp to scaled rough fish from 65/35 to 75/25
 - Recommend eliminating the waiver of commercial fishing license fees for invasive carp only harvest
 - Include hoop net and seine with construction specifications as allowable commercial fishing gear in the Invasive Carp Harvest Program and provide methods requirements
 - Remove requirement for daily harvest summary card and require additional data to be reported on monthly commercial fishing report
 - KDFWR to update list of program participants monthly instead of weekly

- Remove waterbody list for Experimental Commercial Fishing Methods Program
 - Require Experimental Commercial Fishing Methods License within 30 days of selection for the program
 - Add language to require minimum participation requirement to remain in the Experimental Commercial Fishing Methods Program
 - Broaden program suspension language
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity
- Modifications of Regulations Pertaining to Commercial Fishing Harvest Reporting and Overharvest Protections
 - Amend [301 KAR 1:155](#) – Commercial Fishing Requirements
 - Transition to online application and reporting of commercial fishing harvest
 - Clarify language regarding commercial fishing license suspensions
 - Add the following to list of convictions requiring suspension of commercial fishing licenses:
 - Violation of any size or daily limit
 - Violation of harvesting fish out of season
 - Violation of fishing in any closed waters
 - Except for invasive carp, fish harvested by commercial fishing license holders must stay in the vessel or attached to the vessel until offloaded at the boat ramp
 - Clarify Lower Ohio River Trophy Catfish harvest permit program suspension language
 - Must harvest 10,000 pounds of catfish from the mainstem of the Ohio River
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity
- Committee Meeting Structure
 - Establish Committee Meeting structure, including committee purpose, oversight, and responsibilities
- Creation of a habitat stamp
 - Amend [301 KAR 3:010](#) to require a habitat stamp for users of a WMA
 - Amend [301 KAR 5:022](#) to create fee amounts for residents and non-residents
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity

- Commercial activity on WMAs related to wildlife recovery
 - Amend [301 KAR 3:010](#) to allow for commercial activity for wildlife carcass recovery on a WMA. Require an individual to obtain a commercial activity permit for their recovery service
 - Amend [301 KAR 5:022](#) to create fee amounts for a WMA commercial recovery permit
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity

- Establish an annual, weekly, and one-day dog training permit issued by the department and evaluate and designate tract(s) as Dog Training Area(s) at West Kentucky WMA
 - Amend [301 KAR 3:010](#) - Public Use of Wildlife Management Areas
 - Amend [301 KAR 5:022](#) – License, tag, and permit fees
 - Amend [301 KAR 2:049](#) – Small game and furbearer hunting and trapping on public areas
 - Require a Dog Training Permit (annual, weekly, one-day) for all trainers at West Kentucky WMA
 - Require a per-day fee for groups that hold a valid WMA Use Permit for a sporting dog or associated event at West Kentucky WMA
 - Exempt participants from the Dog Training Permit when participating in a department authorized event approved through the WMA Use Permit
 - Establish that unleashed dogs shall be allowed within the boundaries of a designated dog training area year-round, except for one week prior to September 1 through the first weekend of mourning dove season, youth statewide turkey season, opening weekend of statewide turkey season, and if applicable WMA deer quota hunts
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity

- Special Youth and Veteran’s Waterfowl Seasons Date Change
 - Amend [301 KAR 2:221](#) Waterfowl Seasons and Limits
 - Change the Special Youth Waterfowl Season dates from the Saturday before Thanksgiving and the second Saturday in February to the first consecutive Saturday and Sunday in February
 - Change the Special Veterans and active Military Personnel Waterfowl Season from the Sunday before Thanksgiving and the second Sunday in February to the first consecutive Saturday and Sunday in February
 - Cleanup any other regulations as necessary for conformity

Item: Modify Bear Season

- Amend [301 KAR 2:300](#) to amend bear season as follows:
 - Remove the physical check requirement for harvested bears and require hunters to submit a tooth of any harvested bear to KDFWR via mail
 - Expand the chase-only season beginning the day after spring turkey season through the end of September
 - Prohibit bear chase on Wildlife Management Areas (WMAs) within the elk hunting zone during the month of September to not conflict with elk archery and gun seasons
 - Expand archery and modern gun seasons in bear zone 1 to run a full five days for each season (currently 3 days each)
 - Establish a youth only bear season opening the second Saturday in October and running two days (overlaps the first two days of youth deer) in bear zones 1, 2, and 3

Justification:

Kentucky has a robust population of black bears that have shown a high level of resiliency to increased pressure by hunters. Population goals for many of our core counties have been to hold the growth rate at or slightly above a 0% annual increase. Areas outside the core have experienced bear expansion and population growth even when faced with the potential for consumptive harvest. Bear managers in the Wildlife Division have taken a conservative approach where harvest regulations are slowly liberalized and their subsequent impacts on harvest considered prior to any additional changes. Currently, the Wildlife division recommends liberalizing the bear season incrementally by adding two days to both archery and modern gun season in Zone 1, as well as by adding a two-day youth-only modern gun season to overlap with the first weekend of youth deer season in October. This will add six total

days to bear season for 2026 and represents an incremental adjustment that can be evaluated as the season unfolds.

Additionally, houndsmen have requested more opportunity to train their dogs during the chase-only season. We propose adding an additional month of chase time to the beginning of the season in May. Due to conflicts with elk hunters, the Wildlife Division proposes prohibiting chase season on wildlife management areas (WMAs) within the elk zone, during the month of September. Finally, with the overall number of bears being harvested in the fall increasing and considering additional priorities facing bear program staff, the Wildlife Division proposes removing the requirement to have harvested bears physically checked and instead require a tooth to be submitted. We would like to request mandatory tooth submission, with the penalty for failure to submit a tooth being a loss of bear hunting privileges the following year. Program staff will develop materials and provide training on how to pull the needed tooth as well as make available pre-paid envelopes for returning the tooth to KDFWR. We are highly successful with our elk tooth mail-in program and the necessary bear tooth is much easier to identify and remove.
