

When you harvest a deer in Calloway, Marshall, Graves, Hickman and Fulton counties (CWD Surveillance Zone) this season, **YOU MUST...**

- ✓ COMPLETE YOUR HARVEST LOG IMMEDIATELY upon recovering the deer and before moving it
 - Printable Harvest Log: fw.ky.gov/harvest-log
- ✓ **TELECHECK THE DEER BY MIDNIGHT** on the date recovered
 - Call 1-800-245-4263 or visit fw.ky.gov
- **✓ GET YOUR DEER TESTED FOR CWD AND AGED (NO CHARGE):**

Take the deer to a CWD Check Station (mandatory Nov. 12–14, Nov. 19–21, Nov. 26–27, 2022; There is no mandatory deer check station requirement outside of these dates.)

- CWD check stations open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. (Central) during these dates

Outside of these dates, hunters can have their deer tested for CWD by taking the head to a Deer Sample Collection Station

- ✓ PROCESS THE DEER either at home/camp or at a commercial processor*
 - Use a processor or taxidermist within the 5-county CWD Surveillance Zone or your deer carcass must be de-boned of the meat, be caped out and skull capped with a clean skull plate before transporting out (no intact heads with brain/tissue and/or raw bones).
 - Process yourself in the zone then dispose of unusable parts by burial, landfill or on the land where the deer was harvested.
 - De-bone the meat before transporting out of the 5-county CWD Surveillance Zone.
- ✓ CHECK YOUR CWD TEST RESULTS ONLINE (app.fw.ky.gov/cwdlookup)
- * Whole deer carcasses and high-risk parts (including intact heads containing brain material and/or spinal columns) originating from the 5-county CWD Surveillance Zone cannot be moved out of the Zone. Parts allowed outside of the CWD Surveillance Zone are: clean skulls, clean teeth, de-boned meat, finished taxidermy work, hides, antlers and antlers attached to a clean skull or clean skull plate.
