## **Activity Time!**

For this activity, we are going to use our imaginations and create a new snake! Below are three columns of options. Pick one option from each row and draw what you think a snake would look like with all the options that you have selected.

In the video, Rachel talks about a few ways that this snake will warn off predators. Pine snakes often hiss loudly when feeling threatened, this can sound much like a rattlesnake! She also mentions ways the pine snake can live underground for most of the year. The pine snakes' blunt nose helps her to dig a burrow underground and her diet consists mainly of rodents. These are called adaptations; something that helps an animal to survive better in the wild.

Remember! We want our snakes to have the best chance of survival, so keep that in mind when creating your new species and their adaptations!
